

Willow Art Space is delighted to present 'THE ABSENT ACTOR,' an online group exhibition curated by Gem Zhang, featuring three contemporary artists: Lucas Pertile, Shoora Majedian, and Beatrice Alici. The exhibition will run from February 28th to March 27th.

With each swing towards life, Pertile is pulled back by gravity towards death; as Majedian sways towards time, force beckons it back towards timelessness. Alici gracefully oscillates between imperfection and perfection, embodying a presence that is both here and there, yet simultaneously nowhere, rendering each of them an absent actor.

Each year, Pertile returns to the untamed Jungle of Misiones, Argentina, where he resides in a primitive setting devoid of modern amenities. Amidst the verdant foliage and the ever-watchful gaze of the Rattlesnake, Pertile finds himself a stranger in nature's embrace. Yet, within this primal realm, he discovers a profound humility and a reverence for the sublime. Much akin to his rustic lifestyle, his artistic oeuvre consistently evokes the mysterious, perilous, and entrancing spirit of South America.

Majedian takes a detached approach to memory and existence, using painting as a medium to interweave political and historical elements, thereby reconstructing timeless moments. Many of the pieces in this exhibition draw inspiration from Majedian's birthplace and the Bas-Reliefs of Persepolis in Iran, where reality and myth converge through the medium of paint.

Hailing from the enchanting city of Venice, Alici's creations often portray ancient, eternal nights inhabited by enigmatic, dreamlike goddesses and witches. Alici casts her gaze upon reality, capturing the magical, serene, sacred, and dynamic inner worlds of women.

THE ABSENT ACTOR will also pledge a portion\* of its proceeds to <u>UNICEF's</u> global initiatives to support children worldwide affected by armed conflicts and natural disasters. With each moment of hope, children affected are pulled back by the gravity of adversity, yearning for stability amidst chaos. UNICEF, standing as a beacon of compassion and resilience, offers a lifeline to these vulnerable children, striving to bridge the gap between despair and hope.



## SHOORA MAJEDIAN

Born in 1981 in Tehran, Iran, Majedian lives and works in Vancouver, Canada.

Majedian's artistic practice delves into the intricate consequences of theocracy, contemplating the emancipation and constraints of the figure within space. Informed by her embodied experiences, a comparative language emerges in her paintings, intertwining movement, chaos, and contrasting visual elements. The inspiration for her painting content arises from the relationship between ordinary moments and socio-political imprints.

Each of Majedian's painting represents a new exploration, demanding fresh markmaking and formal decisions. Whether driven by theme or the challenge of depiction, she aims to imbue each work with a distinct expression and mood. Entitled "Bloody Lipsticks," part of this body of paintings portrays the convergence of female figures with a camel, illustrating a transformative morphing of these entities. The camel (surviving in the desert without drinking water for a long time) symbolizes endurance in the face of adversity. The visual interplay between the bullet and lipstick patterns accentuates contrast between elements of femininity vs violence



These sociopolitical narratives strive to represent contemporary Middle Eastern challenges through a familiar Western visual language, offering a more nuanced perspective than what social media and news outlets convey to both Western and non-Western audiences.

## ALICI

Born in 1992 in San Donà di Piave, Venice, Beatrice lives and work in Milan, Italy.

Alici's artistic research is linked to the theme of a return to a primordial psychological space. Archaic and timeless places are mainly represented in nocturnal scenes, in which figures and natural landscapes merge into each other. The night represented is imaginary, the darkness is a symbolic space that allow the artist to delve into the repre-sentation of intimate places with an introspective character.

The figures that most frequently populate her imagery are female, who are represented with enigmatic, supernatural elements, often linked to folklore: depicted as goddesses or witches, they evoke a divine matriarchy.

The use of moonlight is a further symbolic suggestion to the sphere of the sacred and primordial feminine, making the scenes depicted more delicate, dreamlike and mysterious.

Thus, images emerge of an inner world of the artist far removed from reality, emphasized by references to the magical and surreal.
